Reading

Your child has been digging deep into Historical Fiction while reading a class shared reading book. Ask your child about the time period they are learning about and what is different then versus now!

Each week, your child works on a Reading program called Newsela. Students read a nonfiction passage and then answer 4 questions about the text. They are expected to highlight where in the passage they found their answers so that they understand that they need to look back in the text to verify that they have the correct answer. This work will prep your child for the upcoming Forward exam in April. Ask your child to show you some of the great articles they have been reading!

Technology Skill Prep

Our students will be taking the state Forward Exam this Spring, which requires them to be pretty tech savvy! We have put together some great activities for the kids to practice skills like clicking/dragging, highlighting, copy/paste, etc. Your child's teacher has, or will be adding these links to their Google Classroom account. Students will have time at school to practice these skills, but allowing them a little computer time at home will help too! Please let your child's teacher know if you have any questions.
