

As part of my Behavioral Expectations in music, I use Love & Logic techniques to help students solve their problems to the best of their abilities without creating a problem for others. If they are not able to do this, I am always there to help assist them in their problem solving. Restorative practices are also a part of my class routine. It is important to make all children feel they are heard and are accepted within the group no matter what situation may arise.

Communication is very important to me and making sure that any pertinent information gets to you in a timely fashion. I always check with the homeroom teacher to see if you, as the parent, have specified a way that you prefer to be contacted. I am happy to reach out to you by phone, e-mail, before school drop off or after school pick up. I will try to honor your request and get you any information needed about your child in a timely manner. 



We learn about art elements and principles, how other people make their art, how different cultures create, and we talk about being our unique selves! 1/2 graders are working on Mondrian Monsters, learning about primary colors! 
Anna and I are both so excited for the new school year! Be sure to stop in or send along any questions you have. We love to hear from families!
